



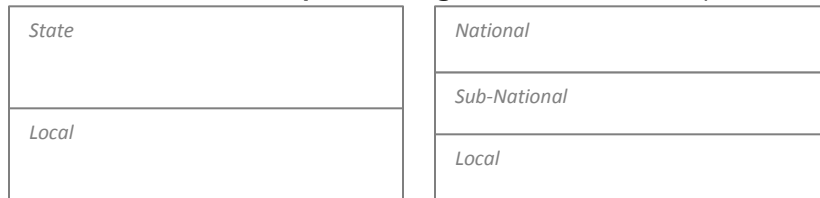
Connect the organizations from Column 1 to Column 2. Use different colors to denote the different formal relationships as such:

Nature of relationship/ties	Color used for lines
Funding	Fill in with color
Legal Accountability	Fill in with color
Service Linkages	Fill in with color
Other significant types of relationship (e.g. <i>list here</i> )	Fill in with color

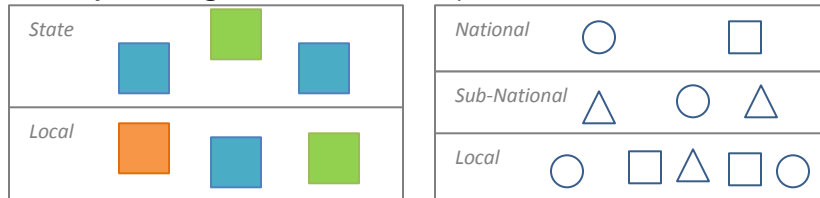
### Step 2

Create a visual representation of the field and the relationships. Start with a blank surface (e.g. a flipchart, or a white board). Depending on the complexity of the policy field's institutions and relationships, you will want to consider the following tools/methods:

- Divide the blank surface to **horizontally stacked sections** to denote the **level of operation/governance**. *Example:*

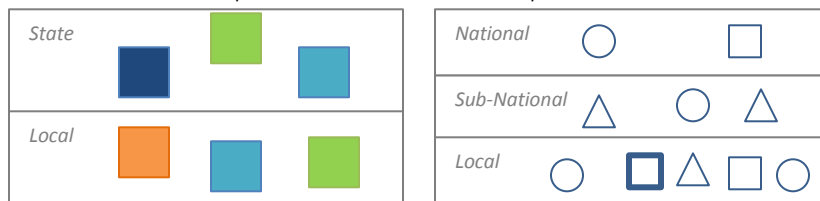


- Use **different color Post-Its or shapes** to designate **public, private, or nonprofit organizations**. *Example:*



- Use a **different shade (of the same color)** to indicate **high levels of authority**. *Example:*

Here, the first square on the top left is shaded a darker blue.  
In the second example, the outline of the shape is made thicker.



- Use different colors (for lines) to differentiate the nature of the institutions' relationships with each other. (You can use the same colors from Step One.) *Example:*
